Delivering Better Value in SEND – Survey for parents and carers of children and young people with SEND

North Yorkshire Council are currently running a survey that will help them better understand your views of special education needs and disabilities (SEND) support in North Yorkshire. They are inviting parents and carers of children and young people with SEND to share their views on what is working well and what can be improved.

Your response will be used to help them identify areas for improvement and inform an application for a grant from the Department for Education (DfE) to help them further improve supports and services in North Yorkshire.

In line with the Local Area SEND Strategy, they want to put children and young people at the heart of this plan and your views as a parent or carer are important to make sure they are focussing on the right areas.

Raving Readers 2023-2024

Research has proven that regular reading helps children to make progress in ALL areas of the curriculum.

Each class has a 'Raving Readers' chart in the classroom. Each time a child reads their school book or Whole Class Guided Reading text (at the weekend) at home they get to move their name along the chart. All reading MUST be recorded in planners (including page numbers) and signed by an adult; these are checked daily. We are awarding a maximum of one move per day. Our school expectation is that children read at home at least 5 times per week.

Free school meals for all years for pupils whose families receive financial support

If you get certain benefits, your child could also qualify for free school meals during all school years. This is different to the Universal Infant Free School Meal all children in Apple and Ash currently receive. To qualify you must be receiving:

Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods (£616.67 per month)

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Please note that contributions-based benefits, including contribution-related Jobseekers' Allowance do not entitle you to claim free school meals.

You will receive an instant decision on whether your application is successful. If it is, we will fully process the application in 5 working days and notify the school. Once the school have received this your child can begin enjoying free school meals. You should continue to pay until confirmation comes through. Schools may be able to arrange reimbursement of payment made while your entitlement is being confirmed. Free school meals claims cannot be backdated. They are awarded from the date we receive the application, once eligibility is confirmed. This is because there is a legal requirement for a request to be made, before a free school meal can be provided. If you are not entitled to free school meals, you will be notified in writing.
