Raving Readers 2025-2026

Research has proven that regular reading helps children to make progress in ALL areas of the curriculum. Each class has a 'Raving Readers' chart in the classroom. Each time a child reads their school book or Whole Class Guided Reading text (at the weekend) at home they get to move their name along the chart. All reading MUST be recorded in planners (including page numbers) and signed by an adult; these are checked daily. We are awarding a maximum of one move per day. **Our school expectation is that children read at home at least 5 times per week.**

This is a great event and one we have taken part in annually. This year numbers are restricted by the organiser, so please return your form indicating if your child would or would not like to be considered. All pupils selected to represent school must be aware that best behaviour as well as best effort running are essential. Parents are welcome to attend the cross country event. All parents MUST sign in on arrival, receive a visitor sticker, and sign out when leaving, but there is no expectation that you do attend.

This is a pathway event, meaning that the quicker runners are then invited to represent Skipton at the Craven finals later this term.

School Uniform

A reminder that our school uniform is:-

- Navy sweatshirt with school logo (NO hoodies during the school day)
- Navy cardigan with school logo (again- no hoodies please)
- Trousers, shorts, skirts, Pinafore – dark grey, navy or black
- White polo shirt (with or without logo)
- Dark coloured school shoes with sensible heels (no trainers)
- Blue gingham dress

- Simple headband
- Long hair should be tied back

Please also note that hoodies are not to be worn every day, but they may be used as a much needed extra layer in PE lessons.

Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly named. This ensures that lost property can be returned to pupils quickly.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ATTENDING SPORTING EVENTS - SPECTATORS

- Remember that young people play organised sports for their own enjoyment.
- Applaud all good play by your own team and the other team
- Do not use profane language
- Do not harass, physically or verbally, players, managers, coaches, referees or officials
- Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them, there would be no game
- Praise your schools' efforts whether they win, lose or draw
- Never ridicule or scold a young person for making a mistake during a game
- Condemn the use of violence and verbal abuse
- Respect the match officials' decisions. Remember he/she is only human with the same feelings as you and, like you, sometimes makes an honest error
- We rely on volunteers and young leaders to help run events, please help us to encourage them to stay involved in sport and not to be put off.
- Show your appreciation to all officials, coaches and helpers
- Encourage players always to play according to the Laws of the Game
- Read the Laws of the Game to better understand what you are looking at and commenting on
- Although you are not playing remember that you should act in a sporting manner as your school will be judged by your behaviour. Young people learn best by following a good example
- If you have any problems or questions, take them to the event organiser
