Y6 Trip to London

We travelled back on the underground to Kings Cross and had a picture at platform 9 ¾ (Harry Potter). Next, we got on the train. We arrived in Skipton—everyone was very tired. We all had a brilliant day.

The School Gateway

We have had a few parents saying they are not receiving text messages from school. We have looked into this and it appears to arise when the school gateway app is installed on your phone. If a parent wishes to receive push notifications for their School Gateway app they must ensure that push notifications are manually turned on for this app within their phone settings.

For Apple devices:

- On your phone go to Settings
- Scroll down to the "Notifications Centre"
- Select School Gateway
- Ensure that under the heading "Notification Centre" notifications are switched on
- Close the screen; you will now receive notifications when new app messages come through

For Android devices:

- On your phone go to Settings > Applications Manager
- Scroll down your list of apps and select School Gateway
- Ensure the tick box that says "Show Notifications" is selected
- Close the screen; you will now receive notifications when new app messages come through.

Whilst we are on the subject of text messages, please do not reply to text messages as the inbox is not monitored. Please either telephone or email school.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

The Young Artists Section is divided into four age groups: 0-5 years, 6-9 years, 10-13 years and 14-18 (entrants must be under 19 years of age on 1 September 2022). All visitors will be asked to vote for their favourite artwork. The Young Artist maker of the most popular artwork will receive a prize and a certificate and the most popular works in each age group will receive a certificate.

Number of artworks you can enter either one or two artworks for display in the Young Artists section e.g. drawing, painting, collage, sculpture etc.

Deadline for entries the deadline for receipt of your entry form is Sunday 5 June.

Confirmation of entry your entry will be confirmed on or before Wednesday 8 June.

Entry Forms Please complete by hand and send one entry form per person. To request more forms please email gargravearts@gmail.com or collect a paper copy from the Library at Gargrave Village Hall.

Original work All works must not have been exhibited with us before and be original, meaning all your own work.

PRESENTATION OF ARTWORK

Frames If your art is framed it should include D rings and cord, or mirror plates on the back to hang safely. Or you may use a lightweight clip frame.

NFS (Not for Sale) if you do not wish to sell your work write NFS (not for sale) on the form and on the label.

Label All pictures must have a label fixed securely on the back.

Labels must state the first name of the artist and their postcode eg Sophie BD23 3SP.

Also write the title, medium and price or NFS.

Price If you wish to sell your work, write the price clearly on the label. If the label price differs from the entry form the Committee reserves the right to sell at the lower amount.

Size The maximum picture size we can accept is 50cm x 50cm.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What happens on Receiving Day? This is the day when you must bring your art work unpacked to the Village Hall. At the front desk someone will take your artwork. You will be given a receipt. Please keep this very safe.

The Village Hall is on West Street, Gargrave BD23 3RD. If you are delayed please let us know on 07850447697.

What happens if there are too many pictures? If there is too much work for the space available, we will do our very best to show as much as possible. If we cannot display your artwork, the Committee's decision is final.

What happens if my picture sells? We will telephone you if all your pictures sell and you do not need to come to the hall to collect your work. You will receive a cash payment within three weeks of the end of the exhibition..

What happens if I win the award? If your artwork is voted the most popular in the exhibition then we will telephone you on Sunday afternoon and ask you to come in with your family for a presentation.

What happens if I want to keep my artwork? If your artwork has not sold or you did not want to sell it, you need to collect it from the Village Hall on Sunday 17 July between 6pm and 7pm. It is essential you bring your Receipt that you were given on Receiving Day with you. If you forget your receipt, we may not be able to give you your artwork.
