## Homework Policy

Following research published by EEF the homework policy has been reviewed. It supports the core learning at school and links with learning in the classroom. Research says this is the most effective way to have impact.

## How much time should homework be?

It varies. It depends on the age and the type of work to be done. Spread over a few nights, short sharp sessions should keep the child's interest high rather than several hours in one night or leaving it to the last minute. Guidance from the government states:

Years 1 and 2: one hour per week Years 3 and 4: 1.5 hours per week Years 5 and 6: 30 minutes per day

## What should homework be?

Learning at home should complement learning in school.
