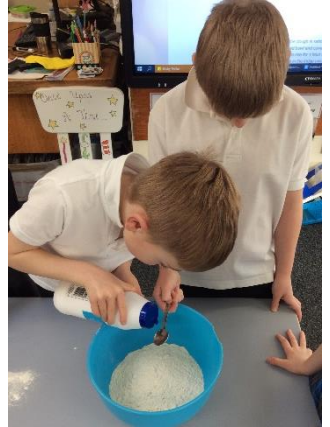


We have had a busy start to the Spring Term in Ash class. In Literacy our fiction work has been based on the book *The Storm Whale in Winter* by Benji Davies. We worked hard to use new vocabulary, the correct punctuation and a variety of conjunctions in our own versions of the story.

Our non-fiction work this term has been linked with our Maths work (mass) and our History topic – The

Great Fire of London. We followed instructions to make our own loaves of bread, measuring ingredients accurately and reading the method of the recipe carefully. We then wrote our own instructions to share how to make bread.



In Maths the year 2's have been learning about mass and measuring in grams and kilograms. We have been comparing the weight of up to 3 different items using $<$ $>$ and working out the difference between masses. We have also been using lots of manipulatives to explain our answers.

The year 1's have been learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. We have also been learning about measurement and used centimetres to measure the height and length of different objects.



Our topic is The Great Fire of London. In history lessons we have loved learning lots of facts about the fire. We have talked about London and linked our history work with geography looking at maps and discussing capital cities. We have created a piece of art work to share what we know about how the fire spread so far so quickly. When we looked at Samuel Pepys diary we were shocked to discover that Samuel Pepys buried some cheese to keep it safe from the fire!
